CITY, STATE (November __, 2009) – One year after the ceasefire between Israel and the Hamas government in the Palestinian Gaza Strip was broken by the Israeli Air Force's attacks on tunnels in Gaza, LOCAL GROUP HERE and other member groups of the US Campaign to End the Israeli Occupation are drawing attention to the ongoing siege and blockade of the Gaza Strip by the Israeli military. Across the United States, protests, teach-ins, and Congressional call-in days are being held in protest of U.S. support for the illegal siege of Gaza and the 42-year Israeli occupation of Palestinian territory in the West Bank, East Jerusalem, and the Gaza Strip.
